### Executive Summary

Setting a public hearing for June 6, 2022, to consider the installation of traffic calming devices on Smith Drive between Scott Boulevard and Louisville Drive, on Louisville Drive between Chapel Hill Road and City Limits, and on Louisville Drive between Smith Drive and City Limits. The estimated cost of the project is \$130,000.

#### Discussion

Smith Drive scored as the first highest priority project within the 2019 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP), with a score of 85.00 out of a possible 100. Louisville Drive scored as the fifth highest priority project within the 2019 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP), with a score of 74.16 out of a possible 100. The scoring system takes a number of factors into consideration including speed, volume, pedestrian generators in the area, proximity to schools, bike routes, and recent crash history. The majority of the scoring (2/3) is based on speed and volume of vehicles. The speed limit on Smith Drive is 30 mph; however this street scored at the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 45.44 mph and has over 3,500 vehicles traveling on it per day. The speed limit on Louisville Drive is 25 mph; however, this street scored at the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 38.72 mph, and has over 1,500 vehicles traveling on it per day.

Three Interested Parties (IP) meetings were held for this project. The first IP meeting was held virtually between January 18, 2021 and January 29, 2021. The second IP meeting was held on November 8, 2021. The third IP meeting was held on March 22, 2022.

During the first IP meeting, staff gathered information from the public and listened to potential solutions. The majority of those providing comment were in favor of traffic calming to encourage lower speeds.

Using information gathered at the first IP meeting, preliminary plans were developed and presented during the second IP meeting. The majority of those providing comment and in attendance were supportive of the preliminary plan for Louisville Drive. However, the majority of those in attendance did not support the proposed plan for Smith Drive, but did support calming on Smith Drive. The first preliminary plan for Smith Drive proposed using more horizontal calming devices, such as bulb outs, and median islands. Those in attendance and providing comments at the second IP meeting favored using vertical calming devices over the proposed horizontal calming options that were presented during the meeting.



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Based on the feedback received during the second IP meeting, staff redeveloped the preliminary plans for Smith Drive. The redeveloped plans for Smith Drive, and the original preliminary plans for Louisville Drive were presented at a third IP meeting. The majority of those in attendance and providing comments during the third IP meeting comment period were in support of the proposed traffic calming on Louisville Drive and Smith Drive.

Staff would like to proceed with the construction of seven speed tables, seven speed humps, three new marked crosswalks, and centerline and bicycle lane markings on Smith Drive and Louisville Drive during the 2022 construction season.

The calming devices will be located at:

- Speed hump on Louisville Drive near 1802 Labrador Drive
- Speed hump on Louisville Drive near 1705 Bromley Circle
- Speed hump on Louisville Drive near 1206 Louisville Drive
- Speed hump on Louisville Drive near Louisville Park Pond
- Speed hump on Louisville Drive near Louisville Park Entrance
- Speed hump on Smith Drive near 602 Medford Drive
- Speed hump on Smith Drive near 4708 Castlewood Court
- Speed table on Louisville Drive at Tiptree Court
- Speed table on Louisville Drive at Labrador Drive
- Speed table on Louisville Drive at Rainbow Trout Circle
- Speed table on Louisville Drive at Rainbow Trout Drive
- Speed table on Smith Drive at Louisville Drive
- Speed table on Smith Drive at Somerset Drive
- Speed table on Smith Drive at Stone Valley Parkway
- Crosswalk with bulbout islands on Louisville Drive north of Whitefish Drive
- Crosswalk with rectangular rapid-flashing beacons on Smith Drive near Louisville Drive
- Crosswalk with pedestrian refuge median island and rectangular rapid-flashing beacons on Smith Drive at Dayspring Drive.

### Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The estimated cost for the installation of a series of seven speed tables, seven speed humps, and three marked crosswalks on Louisville Drive and Smith Drive, including signs and markings, is \$130,000 paid from Annual Traffic Calming Funds. Long-Term Impact: Staff anticipates the replacement of the traffic calming devices every 15 years.
