Thank you for your help over the phone this week in helping me understand more about this project. I've connected with some of my neighbors who are also interested in giving public comments regarding it. I've included my comments here for you to include in the file.

"Many in our neighborhood of Kings Meadow are happy to hear about the upcoming sidewalk project on Scott Blvd.! Good sidewalks along this very busy road will help to keep pedestrians safe.

One thing we ask in accomplishing this project is that the many trees that border Kings Meadow between Mt. Carmel Ln. and Christian Fellowship Rd. be left in place. These trees provide needed privacy for the homes whose yards border Scott Blvd. As well, for much of the rest of the Kings Meadow the trees provide much needed insulation from the noise pollution that drifts into the neighborhood from the traffic on Scott Blvd. We would greatly appreciate it if you would please do whatever is needed to help keep these trees remaining.
