AN ORDINANCE

determining it is in the public interest to construct improvements at Capen Park to include expansion and repair of the parking lot, installation of a center median bio-swale, concrete walkways, parking lot lighting and trail amenities, and replacement of the electric service; approving and adopting plans and specifications; determining that a portion of the work shall be done by contract; calling for bids through the Purchasing Division for a portion of the work; authorizing a portion of the project may be done by city employees; providing for payment for the improvement; authorizing the City Manager to obtain, execute and record all documents necessary for the improvement; providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law and state-mandated construction safety training; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

WHEREAS, an interested parties meeting for the proposed construction of improvements at Capen Park to include expansion and repair of the parking lot, installation of a center median bio-swale, concrete walkways, parking lot lighting and trail amenities, and replacement of the electric service, was held by the Parks and Department on July 19, 2022 and public comments from an online survey were collected from July 15, 2022 to August 5, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a resolution declaring the necessity for the proposed construction of the improvement project; and

WHEREAS, the notice of a public hearing on this project was published in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the city; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on construction of the proposed improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Council finds that the construction of improvements at Capen Park, in the City of Columbia, Missouri, is necessary for the welfare and improvement of

the city and that it is in the public interest that such improvements be made. Specific improvements include the following:

1. Construction of an asphalt overlay of the existing parking lot and entrance, and construction of an additional parking lot to the west of the existing lot to provide a total of fifty-five (55) parking spaces, to include two (2) ADA accessible parking spaces and access aisle.
2. Installation of a center median bio-swale to improve stormwater controls within the parking lot.
3. Installation of a six (6) foot wide concrete walkway on the east side of the parking lot to connect to the Hinkson Creek Trail.
4. Replacement of the existing electric service and the installation of one additional LED parking lot light and new electric access point at the southwest corner of the parking lot.
5. Installation of park amenities to include new park signage, bike racks, and a three (3) panel informational kiosk.

SECTION 2. The plans and specifications for this improvement project, as prepared by the Director of Parks and Recreation, are hereby approved.

SECTION 3. A portion of the construction of the improvement project shall be done by contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, the laws of the State of Missouri, and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri.

SECTION 4. The Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to call for bids and execute a contract for construction of a portion of the improvement project. As deemed advisable by the City Manager, city employees may be used to construct all other improvements.

SECTION 5. Payment for this improvement shall be made from a donation received from the Capen Family Trust and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. The City Manager is authorized to obtain, execute and have recorded all licenses, easements, deeds and any other conveyances or instruments necessary for the City to complete this improvement project.

SECTION 7. Pursuant to Section 290.250 RSMo., the contract for the improvement project shall provide that not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages, as found by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of Missouri, shall be paid to all workers performing work under any contract in excess of \$75,000.00. The contractor's bond shall guarantee the faithful performance of the prevailing hourly wage clause in the contract.

SECTION 8. Pursuant to Section 292.675 RSMo., the bid specifications and contract for the improvement project shall provide that the contractor and any subcontractor shall provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations) for all employees working on-site. All employees working on the site of the improvement are required to complete the safety program within 60 days of beginning work on the improvement project.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
