Re: Setting a Public Hearing for the Manor Drive Traffic Calming Project

## Executive Summary

Setting a public hearing for March 6, 2023, to consider the installation of traffic calming devices on Manor Drive between Broadway and Rollins Road. The estimated cost of the project is \$8,000.

## Discussion

Manor Drive scored as the 5<sup>th</sup> priority project within the 2021 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP), with a score of 76.00 out of a possible 100. The scoring system takes a number of factors into consideration including speed, volume, pedestrian generators in the area, proximity to schools, bike routes, and recent crash history. The majority of the scoring (2/3) is based on speed and volume of vehicles. Manor Drive scored at the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 41 mph and has over 700 vehicles traveling on it per day.

A sidewalk project was completed on Manor Drive in 2016. As part of this project, traffic calming devices were installed on the north end of Manor Drive. These devices continue to work effectively to reduce the operating speeds on this portion of the roadway. However, on the southern portion of Manor Drive where traffic calming devices are not present, vehicle operating speeds are higher than desirable.

Two Interested Parties (IP) meetings were held for this project. The first IP meeting was held on June 13, 2022. The second IP meeting was held on November 9, 2022.

During the first IP meeting, staff gathered information from the public and listened to potential solutions. Minimal feedback was provided from residents during the IP meeting and comment period.

Preliminary plans were developed and presented during the second IP meeting. Minimal feedback was received regarding the proposed plan for traffic calming.

Staff would like to proceed with the construction of two speed humps on Manor Drive during the 2023 construction season.

The calming devices will be located at the following locations:

- Speed hump on Manor Drive near 404 Manor Drive
- Speed hump on Manor Drive near 508 Manor Drive



## Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The estimated cost for the installation of a series of two speed humps, including signs and markings, is \$8,000 paid from Annual Traffic Calming Funds.

Long-Term Impact: Staff anticipates the replacement of the traffic calming devices every 15 years.
