Re: Resolution for Memorandum of Understanding with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF)

## Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for council consideration an ordinance authorizing the City Manager and the Chief of Police to sign and enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) and the Columbia MO Police Department regarding participation in an ATF Task Force.

## Discussion

The Columbia Police Department has conducted numerous investigations into illegal use and possession of firearms by prohibited persons as well as violent crimes with firearms. This violence has a significant impact on the safety and livability of our community. The objectives of the Task Force include: investigating firearms related violent crimes, investigating persons possessing firearm who, under existing state law, are prohibited from possessing firearms, as well as collect information and intelligence on shootings and violent persons in our community.

Partnering with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives will provide tools and resources to better investigate violent crime and other criminal activity associated with firearms. These investigations can improve safety and quality of life within our community. The Columbia Police Department has a long history of partnering with the ATF, which has resulted in the apprehension of violent criminals and disrupting organized, violent crime occurring in our community.
