Executive Summary

Staff has prepared a Neighborhood Traffic Management Program 2023 Year End Report as it relates to current traffic calming projects. This report includes a summary of the program, a traffic calming priority list, and traffic calming projects listed by Ward. Staff is seeking Council acceptance of the report and authorization to continue the public improvement process for the proposed installation of traffic calming devices on Spencer Avenue and Hanover Boulevard; and pursue traffic calming projects on Rollins Road and Walnut Street.

Discussion

The Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP) was implemented in November of 2013 to streamline and prioritize traffic calming projects. The scoring system is data driven, ensuring that the traffic calming projects are prioritized in a fair and equitable manner. The program allows the City to best serve citizens by methodically implementing the projects in an efficient manner.

The program establishes three levels of traffic calming projects. Level 1 projects can be handled administratively by staff, and include tasks such as signing and pavement markings, that can be accomplished in a relatively short period of time. Staff typically pursues around 20 of these types of projects each year. Level 2 and Level 3 projects are generally more time consuming because they typically have a greater impact on the neighborhood and require Interested Parties meetings, response, data collection and typically require Council action. These projects usually require calming devices such as speed humps or median islands.

In August of 2015, voters passed a ballot initiative to continue the tax for the Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

Staff provides to Council an annual progress report with an update of the existing projects. Documentation attached to this 2023 Year End Report includes:

Council approved the installation of traffic calming devices on Ridgefield Road, Ridgemont, and Highridge Drive in December 2022. All of the traffic calming devices on Ridgefield Road



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have been installed. The majority of speed humps on Ridgemont have been installed. The installation of the remaining traffic calming devices was delayed due to other construction projects in the area, and are expected to be installed in 2024.

Council approved the installation of traffic calming devices on Audubon Drive and Shepard Boulevard in 2023. All speed humps and speed tables have been installed. The improvements to three crosswalks are expected to be completed in 2024.

Council approved the installation of traffic calming devices on South Garth Avenue in 2023. All speed humps and speed tables have been installed. One new crosswalk is expected to be installed in 2024.

Council approved the installation of traffic calming devices on Northland Drive in 2023. All speed humps have been installed. A raised crosswalk is expected to be installed in 2024.

Traffic calming devices will be installed on Garden Drive during the 2024 construction season. Interested Parties meetings were held on April 10, 2023 and August 9, 2023. A Public Hearing was held November 6, 2023, and Council approved the installation of traffic calming devices.

Traffic calming devices will be installed on Hulen Drive during the 2024 construction season. Interested Parties meetings were held on May 8, 2023 and October 24, 2023. A Public Hearing was held January 16, 2024, and Council approved the installation of traffic calming devices.

Spencer Avenue is currently 1st on the 2023 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program Scoresheet with a score of 79.50. Interested Parties meetings were held on April 25, 2023 and January 23, 2024. A Public Hearing with City Council is expected to be held on April 1, 2024.

Hanover Boulevard is currently 3rd on the 2023 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program Scoresheet with a score of 72.33. Interested Parties meetings were held on October 25, 2023 and February 27, 2024. A Public Hearing with City Council will be scheduled in the near future.

Rollins Road (Fairview Road to Stadium Boulevard) is currently 2nd on the 2023 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program Scoresheet with a score of 78.57. Staff recommends pursuing this project.

Walnut Street (east of Old 63) is currently 4th on the 2023 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program Scoresheet with a score of 72.00. Staff recommends pursuing this project.

A public hearing was held for Russell Boulevard in May, 2023. A proposed plan for calming was presented, and Council voted to not move forward with the traffic calming project. Russell Boulevard has been removed from the Neighborhood Traffic Management Scoresheet.



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Staffing and resources allow for a limited number of calming projects to be completed per year. Unless otherwise directed, staff recommends pursuing the following projects in 2024:

- 1. Complete installation of traffic calming devices on Ridgemont and Highridge Drive.
- 2. Complete installation of traffic calming devices on Audubon Drive and Shepard Boulevard.
- 3. Complete installation of traffic calming devices on South Garth Avenue.
- 4. Complete installation of traffic calming devices on Northland Drive.
- 5. Install traffic calming devices on Garden Drive.
- 6. Install traffic calming devices on Hulen Drive.
- 7. Complete public process for traffic calming devices on Spencer Avenue, and potentially install traffic calming devices dependent on future Council direction.
- 8. Complete public process for traffic calming devices on Hanover Boulevard, and potentially install traffic calming devices dependent on future Council direction.
- 9. Pursue Rollins Road (Fairview Road to Stadium Boulevard) traffic calming project.
- 10. Pursue Walnut Street (east of Old 63) traffic calming project.
- 11. Continue to address Level 1 calming projects per the Neighborhood Traffic Management Program guidelines.

Also provided for information purposes is a list of platting dates for the various streets that are in the NTMP in relation to the adoption of the City's Complete Streets policy and additional modifications for requiring curvilinear design for local streets. Most of the streets within the NTMP were constructed prior to the current adopted Complete Street approach with only 12 streets platted after the Complete Streets adoption and most of those being platted prior to more rigorous curvilinear requirements. While not definitive and there may be concerns expressed in the future, this does apparently point to a general success in limiting concerns along newer constructed residential and neighborhood collector streets.

Fiscal Impact
