Executive Summary

This is an Ordinance to approve the adoption of the FY 2017 budget.

Discussion

The FY2017 annual budget being proposed by the City Manager has been submitted to the City Council as required by city charter. Staff has prepared a separate Resolution setting the public hearings for the FY2017 Annual Budget to be held on August 15, September 6, and September 19. This procedure will allow several opportunities for public input on the many items covered by the budget process.

In additional to the public hearings, the City Council will be holding a budget work session to further discuss, in general detail, departmental revenues and expenses proposed for the coming fiscal year. The proposed Council budget work session is Saturday, August 20.

Following the work session and the public hearings, any final adjustments will be made by Council prior to the passage of the budget on September 19.
