Re: Bid Call – PCCE #39 Hubbell Drive Sanitary Sewer Project

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration an ordinance authorizing a call for bids through the Purchasing Division to construct the Private Common Collector Elimination (PCCE) #39, Hubbell Drive Sanitary Sewer project. An Interested Parties (IP) meeting was held on January 15, 2015, and a public hearing was held May 18, 2015. The estimate for this project is \$165,000, with funding from Sanitary Sewer Utility enterprise funds.

Discussion

The PCCE #39, Hubbell Drive Sanitary Sewer project involves constructing new sanitary sewers to serve ten (10) parcels of land that are currently served by a combination of private common collector and laterals that do not conform to current standards. This project will construct approximately 275 linear feet of sanitary sewer main and will include new private service connections and replacement of service laterals, as required to reconnect the existing structures to the new sewer main as shown on the attached diagram. There are ten parcels affected by this project, and staff worked with the property owners on the location of the main serving their properties. The sewer improvement is located in the roadway, which is on the Public Works list for major street maintenance. The project was moved forward so that sewer work would not damage any road resurfacing. After sewer work is complete, Public Works will mill and overlay the street.

Construction plans are complete, and all necessary easements have been obtained. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2017

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The total project cost, including construction, is estimated at \$165,000, and will be paid from Sewer Utility Enterprise Revenue funds.

Long-Term Impact: This project will not have a significant impact to annual maintenance and operation costs.
