Executive Summary

A resolution authorizing the transfer of \$3,000 from Council Reserve to Human Services Miscellaneous Contractual to support the 2016 Columbia/Boone County Homelessness Summit.

Discussion

At its October 3, 2016 meeting, the City Council requested that a resolution be prepared by staff to transfer \$3,000 from the Council Reserve to provide support for the 2016 Columbia/Boone County Homelessness Summit. The event is sponsored by the City of Columbia, County of Boone, MU Health Care, and the Heart of Missouri United Way. The purpose of the summit is to provide a forum for education, information sharing, and discussion about the issue of homelessness. The summit goals include identifying: the current scope of needs and actions surrounding the issue of homelessness in Boone County; innovative approaches to addressing homelessness that are emerging as promising practices other communities; three to five SMART goals addressing homelessness in Boone County.
