### Executive Summary

The Office of Sustainability is requesting City Council approval of an ordinance accepting and appropriating a \$25,000 grant from 3M Foundation for the CoMo Common Ground – monarch butterfly habitat restoration project. The goal of this grant is for preservation and enhancement of Monarch butterfly migration corridors and population recruitment centers within an urban center.

#### Discussion

The 3M Foundation is partnering with the Office of Sustainability for the preservation and enhancement of Monarch butterfly migration corridors and population recruitment centers within an urban center. Three interconnected activities compose the core of our proposed work - restoration of Monarch habitats; propagation of host plants; and local capacity building via community outreach for additional habitat conservation and long-term management of host and nectaring vegetative patches.

Columbia - considering its location, ecological and geographical context, site and systemscale restoration opportunities, and the network of stakeholders that have been convened provides an outstanding contribution to the long-term population viability of Monarch butterfly populations.

Through support from 3M, the Office of Sustainability proposes to expand our CoMo Common Ground work to focus on urban pollinators and Monarchs, thereby leveraging an existing local network to create increased migration and breeding habitat, milkweed coverage, and future restoration capacity. We believe the resultant CoMo Common Ground for Monarch Butterfly Habitat program - one which integrates public properties and partnerships, corporate stakeholders, and community engagement - could in turn serve as a model for other small and large cities to replicate.
