Site Description The site consists of a single large mound. Mound is fairly large in size and very distinctive. It lies on the highest point of the hill above Perche Creek. The hill is isolated by river meanders of Perche Creek to the north and west. It was noted while entering along a two-track down to site 23B0956 during University of Missouri testing of the latter site.

Site appears to be in a relatively good state of preservation, although it was not closely examined. There have been no known excavations, but there were no conversations with the land owner. 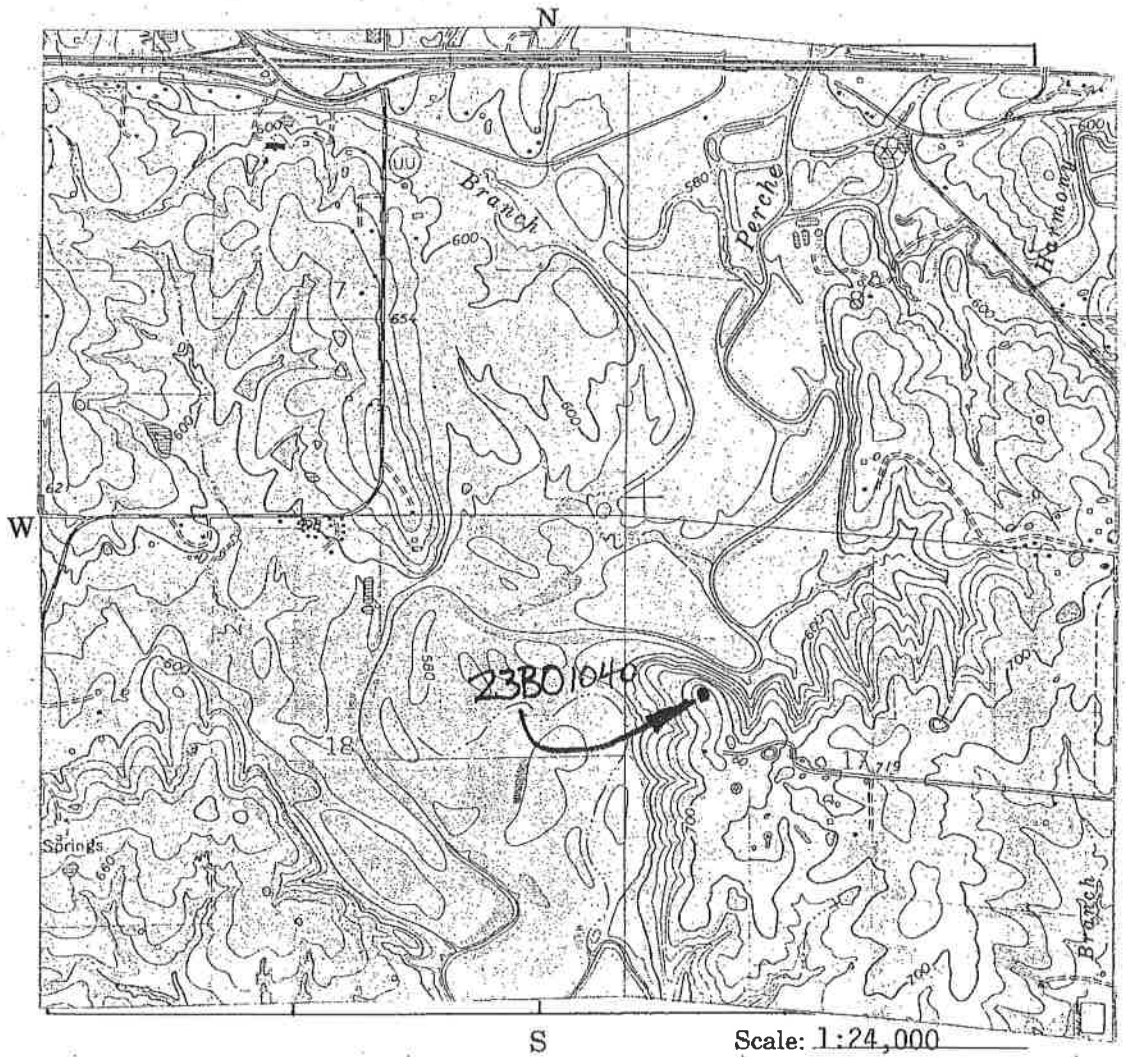

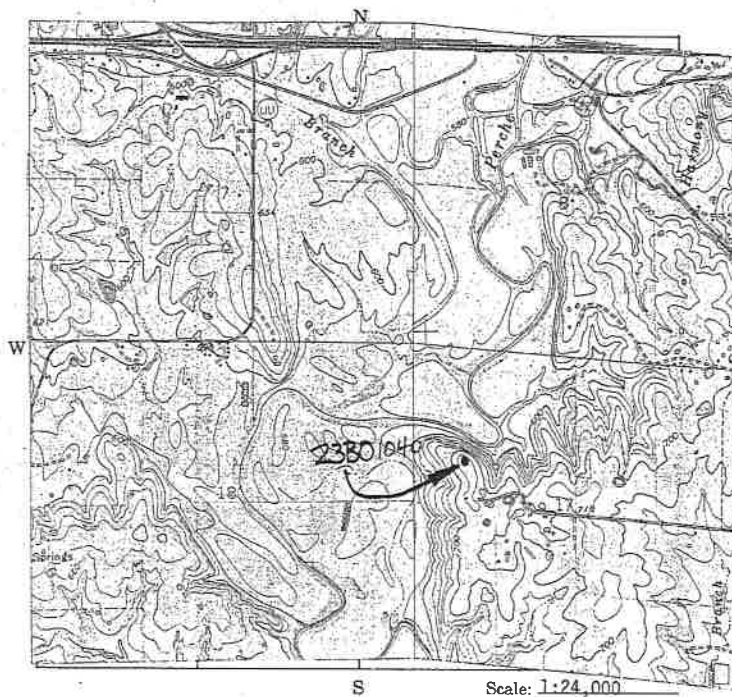
