Project name and brief description: <u>Waters Moss Memorial Wildlife Area: Waters House</u> <u>Renovations – The Parks and Recreation Department is proposing to use park staff to</u> <u>complete interior and exterior renovations to the Waters House at Waters Moss Memorial</u> <u>Wildlife Area. The interior renovations to the home will include the addition of ADA accessible</u> <u>restroom facilities, new flooring, electrical improvements, kitchen replacement and painting.</u> <u>The exterior renovations will include new ADA accessible walkways and concrete board siding</u> <u>on the exterior of the building. A portion of the building is occupied by the Park Ranger</u> <u>Program, and the proposed improvements will focus on the areas of the building to be used as</u> <u>rental space for private citizens, groups and Osher Lifelong Learning. The improved reservable</u> <u>space is expected to generate additional revenue for the Recreation Services Division and also</u> <u>provide additional classroom space for Parks and Recreation programs and Osher Lifelong</u> <u>Learning. As budgeted in the City's FY-2017 CIP, the improvements will be funded by the</u> <u>2015 Park Sales Tax. The building renovation project is anticipated to be completed by spring</u> <u>2017.</u>
