Dear Lee

I apologize for being so late in responding to your requests for comments on traffic calming on Stewart Rd.

My wife, Laura, and I live on East Stewart Road, which apparently wasn't intended to be included in this project. However, we strongly urge the city to consider our addition.

We have owned our home for a little over 30 years and have seen Stewart go from a slightly busy residential street to a fairly significant thoroughfare in Columbia. You cited the amount of traffic on West Stewart...please keep in mind that a large volume of that (I believe) passes over East Stewart as part of its journey across town. It seems that much of the traffic travels at or above the speed limit.

Because of its proximity to the University campus and the Katy Trail, Stewart gets a lot of pedestrian and bicycle usage. We, and quite a number of our neighbors, walk our dogs up and down Stewart (and surrounding neighborhood) at least twice a day. Crossing Stewart can be difficult, particularly between 7-9 am & 4-6 pm. Bicyclists have marked lanes, but parking on the street (student and commercial) often forces bicyclists out of their lane and into the regular traffic lane. (We alert the police whenever possible, in order to keep the street clear, but sometimes it takes time for a call to be answered and/or a vehicle to be moved.) This is particularly dangerous near 101 E. Stewart, about the top of the hill. It is difficult, if not impossible, to always see traffic coming. For pedestrians, there is no sidewalk from Garth to about 13 E. Stewart.

We would like to see any or all of the following:

A sidewalk on the north side of East Stewart Road, from Garth to the triplex apartments (about 13 E. Stewart).

1 or 2 crosswalks across Stewart, between Garth and Providence Road, with signs to indicate an upcoming crosswalk.

A speed hump to slow traffic...one located between Oak Manor apartments and the drive to the SAE fraternity lane would seem to be a good idea...it might make it harder for someone to speed up a lot going eastward from the Garth/Stewart intersection, and it might slow people down who pop over the hill, going westward from Providence.

A reduction of 5 miles per hour in the speed limit for at least the east section of Stewart (all of Stewart would be nice, too).

As for traffic calming efforts on West Stewart Road, we don't have any particular preferences, other than the use of speed humps over more expensive options such as street narrowing, obstacles, etc. Locationwise, at the intersection of Stewart and Westmount/West Parkway may be a good idea...some of the people in the Parkway neighborhood have mentioned the volume of traffic on West Parkway. That intersection is a part of one of our dog-walking routes...a crosswalk or speed hump would certainly be convenient for us to have a safer place to cross.

Again, we have been homeowners along here for over 30 years. Some of what drew us to this neighborhood disappeared when Stewart was "improved" about 28 years ago. We would like to keep the neighborhood feel here as much as possible and not deteriorate any more in the face of growing population and traffic.
