## **A RESOLUTION**

setting a public hearing; declaring the necessity for the proposed construction of a storm water management basin project for the area bounded by Garth Avenue, Sexton Road, Oak Street and Lynn Street; stating the nature of and the estimate of the cost of the proposed improvement; providing source of funds for payment for the proposed improvement; and providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law.

WHEREAS, interested parties meetings for the proposed construction of a storm water management basin project for the area bounded by Garth Avenue, Sexton Road, Oak Street and Lynn Street was held by the City Utilities Department – Sewer/Stormwater Division on November 15, 2016 and August 23, 2017.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. A public hearing in respect to the proposed public improvement set forth herein will be held in the Council Chamber of the City Hall Building, 701 E. Broadway, Columbia, Missouri, at 7:00 p.m. on December 4, 2017. The City Clerk shall cause notice of this hearing to be published in a newspaper published in the City.

SECTION 2. The City Council deems the proposed construction of a storm water management basin project for the area bounded by Garth Avenue, Sexton Road, Oak Street and Lynn Street, necessary to the welfare and improvement of the City.

SECTION 3. The nature and scope of the proposed improvement shall consist of furnishing all labor, materials, transportation, insurance and all other items, accessories and incidentals thereto necessary for the complete construction of the improvements.

SECTION 4. The estimated cost of this proposed improvement is \$105,000.

SECTION 5. Payment for this proposed improvement shall be made from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. Any work done in connection with the construction of the proposed improvement specified above shall be in compliance with the provisions of the prevailing wage laws of the State of Missouri. The City shall also cause to be inserted into the contract a stipulation that all laborers and mechanics employed by the contractor or subcontractors in the performance of work under the contract shall be paid wages at rates

not less than those prevailing on similar construction in the locality as determined by the Secretary of Labor in accordance with the Davis-Bacon Act.
