Executive Summary

At the request of Council member Trapp, an amendment sheet has been prepared for R185-17.

Discussion

The proposed amendment to Section 2 of R185-17 deletes the reference to the sponsoring organization for the initiative petition and corrects the identifying number of the petition. The correct initiative petition reference number is 2018-051 and attached for your reference.

There is no difference in the content between initiative petition 2018-051 and 2018-054 approved by the Secretary of State for submission to the voters; however, it is important to be consistent in the designation and circulation of a single petition. In the event you are attempting to compare the two versions, the identifier is the date/time stamp. Initiative petition 2018-051 was filed at 2:41 and petition 2018-054 was filed at 2:44.
