<sup>\*</sup>Divergence – Per Insurance Services Offices, Inc. (ISO): "Even the best fire department will be less than fully effective if it has an inadequate water supply. Similarly, even a superior water supply will be less than fully effective if the fire department lacks the equipment or personnel to use the water. The FSRS score is subject to modification by a divergence factor, which recognizes disparity between the effectiveness of the fire department and the water supply."

<sup>\*\*</sup>Final ISO rating for the City of Columbia is a split classification of 2/2X. Properties inside the City Limits of Columbia, within 5 road miles of a fire station and within 1000 feet of a creditable water source (typically a hydrant) receive an ISO rating of 2. Properties inside the city limits of Columbia and within 5 miles of a fire station, but not within 1000 feet of a creditable water source will receive an ISO rating of 2X (which is the equivalent of the older 9 rating).

## **Columbia Fire Department Concerns:**

**Line 561. Credit for Deployment Analysis** - this extremely low score reflects our need to distribute more fire station locations in the city.

Line 571. Credit for Company Personnel – this extremely low score reflects the need for additional on-duty staffing.

Line 631. Credit for Inspections and Flow Testing – this low score is due to a gap in hydrant testing that occurred due to concerns on chlorine release during testing. Water & Light has adjusted their method of testing, but there has not been enough time to complete a full cycle of testing as of the time of the ISO review. This situation should correct itself.

**Divergence** – Please see the definition above. The divergence modification corresponds with the rating given to the Fire Department Component. Our Water Supply rates as an ISO Grade 1 and our Fire Department rates as an ISO 3. This disparity results in a reduction in overall credits. Increasing grades for both Deployment (561) and Company Personnel (571) would also result in a reduction of the Divergence penalty.
