Dear Mr. Hunt:

Burns & McDonnell Engineering Company, Inc. (Burns & McDonnell) understands that the City of Columbia (City) is interested in conducting a study to evaluate potential improvements and/or alternatives to beneficially utilize the City's generated food waste and other organic wastes. The goal of this Organics Study will be to identify the highest and best use alternative that will exhibit environmental and economic benefits to stakeholders.

Project Scope of Work

Based on our understanding of the project, the project scope of work is organized into the following tasks:

Task 1: Existing Organics Program Evaluation

Burns & McDonnell will evaluate how organics are currently handled by the City and gain a better understanding of the current and potential quantities of organic waste and what additional diversion options may exist for the City.

Task 2: Organics Program Alternatives Evaluation

Burns & McDonnell will evaluate potential organic waste use alternatives including, but not limited to:

- 1. Composting;
- 2. Anaerobic Digestion;
- 3. Combustion; and
- 4. Landfilling.

Key considerations will be evaluated for each alternative including, but not limited to:

- 1. Cost of Operation;
- 2. Cost of Compliance;
- 3. Emissions; and
- 4. Environmental Benefits/Risks.
