




#### Climate Action Planning Process

## **CLIMATE ACTION EMISSION** REDUCTION GOALS Columbia


#### **Reduce Community Emissions**

- 35% by 2035
- 80% by 2050
- 100% by 2060


#### Reduce Municipal Emissions

- 50% by 2035
- 100% by 2050


#### Community Survey results



It is important for Columbia to take immediate action to reduce GHG emissions




It is important for Columbia to take action to prepare for Climate Change

#### Transportation

- 1. Reduce vehicle miles traveled
- 2. Reduce transportation-related greenhouse gas emissions





# Housing, Buildings & Development

1. Reduce housing-, building-, and development-related greenhouse gas emissions.





#### Waste

- 1. 50% waste diversion rate (by recycling and composting) by 2030
- 2. Zero waste (>90% waste diversion) by 2050





#### **Energy**

- 1. Increase renewable energy generation
- 2. Maintain reliability of local energy supply and local distribution





## Health, Safety & well-being

1. Prepare the community and our public safety and health services to prevent or address anticipated climate change impacts





#### **Natural Resources**

- 1. Increase consumption and production of locally produced food.
- 2. Reduce negative impacts from rainwater runoff and flooding
- 3. Increase climate resilience and carbon sequestration potential of public and private lands.



#### **Example Action**

Sector: Natural Resources

Goal: Increase climate resilience and carbon sequestration potential of public and private lands.


Action: Install and maintain native plants on public lands to reduce mowing, stormwater runoff and create pollinator habitat.



#### Next steps

- Evaluating proposed actions for impact
- Drafting implementation plan for priorities
- Draft plan out for public comments in April
- Presenting draft plan to City Council in May
- City Council adopting final CAAP in June
- The real work begins Summer 2019
