ADMINISTRATIVE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Project name and brief description: <u>Cosmo Tennis Court Improvement Project: Park staff is</u> proposing to use contract labor to complete a multi-step renovation process on four of the tennis courts in the eight-court tennis complex at Columbia Cosmopolitan Recreation Area (a.k.a. Cosmo Park). The steps include cleaning all court surfaces, repairing all asphalt cracks using a specialized process to seal all existing cracks, leveling all low areas using a high tensile acrylic court leveler and applying three coats of acrylic court surfacing product to restore the tennis courts to the desired condition of Columbia's tennis users. The final step in the process is to repaint the tennis court lines on each court based on United States Tennis Association specifications. The courts have not been resurfaced since 2007. The entire process for tennis court renovation project is expected to take two weeks. The renovation process will be completed on the four courts on the south side of the complex. The other four courts will remain open for park users during the renovation project. Park staff will include an annual park improvement project in the FY-2020 CIP for the renovation of the four courts on the north side of the tennis complex.
