Re: Organizing and engaging a regional stakeholder meeting related to opioid overdoses

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the Interim City Manager to sign a Letter of Agreement between the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services and the City of Columbia related to organizing and engaging a regional stakeholder meeting related to opioid overdoses; appropriating funds.

Discussion

The Bureau of Reportable Disease Informatics (BRDI) and the Bureau of HIV, STD, and Hepatitis (BHSH) within the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) have received federal funding to develop a vulnerability assessment related to opioid overdoses and bloodborne infections associated with nonsterile drug injection. As part of this project, DHSS is seeking to involve local public health agencies to plan regional stakeholder meetings to gather feedback on the design and use of the vulnerability assessment. Through this Letter of Agreement, Public Health & Human Services will receive \$3,000 in exchange for assisting in identifying and recruiting key stakeholders, procuring the venue and providing lunch for the regional stakeholder meeting, and participating in multiple conference calls. An appropriation is necessary, to cover the costs associated with the stakeholder meeting. This project will end of on August 31, 2019.
