Project name and brief description: <u>Bear Creek Park Improvements – The Parks and</u> <u>Recreation Department is proposing to use contract labor to replace the existing playground</u> <u>structure located at Bear Creek Park. The replacement of the structure is necessary due to the</u> <u>age of the existing structure and to be compliant with current ASTM playground safety</u> <u>guidelines. Park staff will also complete ADA walkway improvements associated with the</u> <u>playground replacement as part of the project. The project is identified in the City's FY-2019</u> <u>CIP and funded by annual park improvement funds from the 2015 Park Sales Tax. The</u> <u>replacement of the playground is scheduled to be completed by winter 2019.</u>
