AN ORDINANCE

determining it is in the public interest to construct a right turn lane and sidewalk on the southeast corner of the intersection of Providence Road and Broadway, as part of the Flat Branch Park Expansion Master Plan; approving and adopting plans and specifications; determining that the work shall be done by contract; calling for bids through the Purchasing Division; providing for payment for the improvement; amending the FY 2020 Annual Budget by appropriating funds; authorizing the City Manager to obtain, execute and record all documents necessary for the improvement; providing for compliance with the prevailing wage law and state-mandated construction safety training; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

WHEREAS, an interested parties meeting for the proposed construction of a right turn lane and sidewalk on the southeast corner of the intersection of Providence Road and Broadway, as part of the Flat Branch Park Expansion Master Plan, was held by the Convention and Visitors Bureau and the Parks and Recreation Department on January 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted a resolution declaring the necessity for the proposed construction of the improvement project; and

WHEREAS, the notice of a public hearing on this project was published in a daily newspaper of general circulation in the city; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has held a public hearing on construction of the proposed improvement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Council finds that the construction of a right turn lane and sidewalk on the southeast corner of the intersection of Providence Road and Broadway, as part of the Flat Branch Park Expansion Master Plan, in the City of Columbia, Missouri, is necessary for the welfare and improvement of the city and that it is in the public interest that such improvements be made. Specific improvements are as follows:

- 1. Construction of approximately 360 linear feet of an 11-foot wide turn lane with 10-inch thick concrete pavement.
- 2. Construction of a 10-foot wide concrete sidewalk and integral curb on the east side of the turn lane.
- 3. Relocation of street lighting and the adjustment of existing utilities.
- 4. Street striping and the installation of signage.

SECTION 2. The plans and specifications for this improvement, as prepared by the Director of Public Works, are hereby approved.

SECTION 3. The construction of the improvement project shall be done by contract in accordance with the plans and specifications, the laws of the State of Missouri, and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri.

SECTION 4. The Purchasing Agent is hereby authorized to call for bids and execute a contract for the improvement project.

SECTION 5. Payment for this improvement project shall be made from capital improvements sales tax funds and such other funds as may be lawfully appropriated.

SECTION 6. The FY 2020 Annual Budget adopted by Ordinance No. 024007 is amended by appropriating the sum of \$45,000.00 from the Annual Streets Account No. 44008830-604990, 40158 to the Providence-Broadway Turn Lane Account No. 44008830-604990, 00713.

SECTION 7. The City Manager is authorized to obtain, execute and have recorded all licenses, easements, deeds and any other conveyances or instruments necessary for the City to complete this improvement project.

SECTION 8. Pursuant to Section 290.250 RSMo., the contract for the improvement project shall provide that not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages, as found by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations of Missouri, shall be paid to all workers performing work under any contract in excess of \$75,000.00. The contractor's bond shall guarantee the faithful performance of the prevailing hourly wage clause in the contract.

SECTION 9. Pursuant to Section 292.675 RSMo., the bid specifications and contract for the improvement project shall provide that the contractor and any subcontractor shall provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations) for all employees working on-site. All employees working on the site of the improvement project are required to complete the safety program within 60 days of beginning work on the project.

SECTION 10. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
