Project name and brief description: <u>Albert-Oakland Park Improvements – The Parks and</u> <u>Recreation Department is proposing to use force account labor to make multiple improvements</u> <u>at Albert-Oakland Park. After meeting with a core group of park users, park staff will replace</u> <u>five existing pieces of outdoor exercise equipment located along the internal concrete trail.</u> <u>The equipment shows heavy signs of wear and two pieces have been removed due to</u> <u>component failure and lack of replacement parts</u>. As part of the department's sustainability <u>plan, park staff will also replace the existing parking lot lighting with LED fixtures</u>. The <u>conversion to LED lighting fixtures will result in lower utility expenses for the park and</u> <u>increased visibility in the parking lots</u>. The project is identified in the City's FY-2020 CIP and <u>funded by annual park improvement funds from the 2015 Park Sales Tax. The improvements</u> <u>at the park are anticipated to be completed by summer 2020.</u>
