## City of Columbia Citizens Police Review Board Supplement to the 2018 Annual Report


This supplemental report was unanimously approved by the Citizens Police Review Board at their regularly scheduled meeting on November 13, 2019. The <u>Citizens Police Review Board 2018 Annual Report</u> was previously submitted at the March 4, 2019 City Council Meeting.

Please consider the following the Citizens Police Review Board Supplement to our 2018 Annual Report. At the time our report was provided to Council, the Columbia Police Department had yet to finalize their annual reports. Below is a summary of complainant demographic details and complaint findings that compares changes from 2017 to 2018. For reference, the 2014, 2015 and 2016 numbers are included.

In the past, the Mayor and Council members had expressed an interest in the CPRB providing further analysis of the materials released by the CPD. As the CPD provides demographic breakdown on only the external complaints, those will be the focus of our analysis. Given the limitations of the data, CPRB does not presume to make conclusions from these numbers, but aims to use this information as it undertakes its duties.



While the Board hesitates to make generalizations based on this material alone, we plan to take it into consideration as we complete our work throughout the year; whether it be outreach or complaint review.
