ADMINISTRATIVE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Project name and brief description: Indoor Facility Improvements – The Parks and Recreation Department is proposing to use a combination of contract and force account labor to make improvements at the Armory Sports and Recreation Center and Riechmann Pavilion at Stephens Lake Park. Park staff is proposing to convert all interior lighting fixtures at the Armory to LED lighting fixtures, including lighting in the gymnasium, common areas and office spaces. Park staff will work with Water & Light staff to apply for a rebate for the lighting conversion through the Columbia Water and Light Department's Lighting Incentive Program upon completion of the project. The conversion to LED lighting will improve visibility in the facility, reduce the overall energy consumption, and lower utility costs at the Armory. Staff is also proposing to complete interior work at Riechmann Pavilion at Stephens Lake Park. Contract labor will also be used to refinish the existing floor at the facility. The stained concrete floors will be stripped of existing wax and polished. Park staff will replace the restroom partitions in the interior and exterior restrooms. The existing partitions are original to the building, which opened in 2006. The Parks and Recreation Commission reviewed the proposed project on November 21, 2019 and recommended proceeding to the City Council for permission to proceed with the project. The project is identified in the City's FY-2020 CIP and funded by annual park improvement funds from the 2015 Park Sales Tax. The improvements to the Armory and Riechmann Pavilion are scheduled to be completed by late spring 2020.
