Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to accept a Voluntary National Retail Food Regulatory Program Standards Grant (G-SP-1910-08116) funded by the United States Food and Drug Administration in the amount of \$3,000 for FY20; appropriating funds.

Discussion

This grant supports continuing conformance with the FDA Voluntary Retail Food Program Standards. Public Health and Human Services has been enrolled in the FDA Voluntary Retail Food Program Standards since 2009. The department will conduct a verification audit of 2 of the 9 standards to demonstrate continued conformance with the program standards. Funding was not anticipated in the FY20 budget. An appropriation is necessary.
