Cole shares that because the CCLT is a subsidiary of the City of Columbia a 990 is not required. Cole shares that there was a \$10,000 donation from an anonymous donor for the Cullimore Cottages Solar panels.

VII. OLD BUSINESS

January 16th Event: Cole gives an overview of the event which includes a social hour, introduction by Board President Anthony Stanton, showing of the documentary, panel discussion with Board member Linda Head, CCLT Realtor and lifelong Columbia resident David Ballenger and himself. *6:40 pm Mendenhall arrives.*

Cole shares that there are event sponsors including Providence Bank, Veterans United, The Alden Family Foundation and the Atrium. Pledge cards are shown to the group and will be available at the event if donors are interested in pledging funds. Maze asks if donation will be able to be given at the event. Clark shares that cash and check will be accepted but credit card donations must be made online via the PayPal link on the website and Facebook pages. Clark asks for permission to purchase cardstock for the pledge cards and asks if the board has a preference on the color of the cardstock. The board shares that white or ivory is fine. The board give verbal approval.

Cullimore Cottages Request for Proposals: Cole shares that staff anticipates that at least two developers will bid on the Cullimore Cottages project, however the hope is several bids. Questions have been answered regarding the RFP and added to the website comolandtrust.com under the Request for Proposals tab.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

Development Financing Proposals: Cole shares that there were four local financial institutions who offered development financing, Central Bank, Landmark Bank, Providence Bank and Callaway Bank. Cole shares that speaking with other land trusts and organizations across the country these offers are excellent. Discussion is had about the different offers. Mendenhall shares that even .25% is a large difference. The board decides to accept Providence Banks offer.

Clark shared that there was an additional GoDaddy.com charge during the month of December. The domain name was purchased through GoDaddy.com rather than what had previously been understood through as Bluehost charges in the previous months, Bluehost only hosts the Wordpress website that the CCLT is able to utilize to update the website comolandtrust.com. Clark shared the domain was repurchased for an additional two years and information for the website was moved into staff's contact information from the previous board presidents. Clark shares that the domain names have been purchased for an additional two years and requests the approval of the board for authorization of this purchase. Without the approval of the board the website would not be reachable.
