Re: Authorizing the Approval of a Sanitary Landfill Closure and Post-Closure Financial

Assurance Instrument (FAI) with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration an ordinance authorizing the City Manager to execute a Contract of Obligation in the amount of \$11,145,648 with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) for the purpose of providing financial assurance for proper closure and post-closure activities of the City of Columbia Sanitary Landfill.

Discussion

Missouri Solid Waste Management law has required annual Financial Assurance Instruments (FAI) of operators of sanitary landfills since 1988. This agreement provides that in the event the City should fail to perform required closure and post-closure activities at the landfill, MDNR shall collect the required amount from any state funds which are normally disbursed to the city in the amount determined to be necessary to complete the City's obligation.

The amounts are based on estimates in current dollars for a third party to conduct and complete closure and post-closure activities. These estimates must equal a maximum closure cost at any time during the life of the facility and include estimates for each closure activity. The Contract of Obligation is reviewed annually and updated when there are changes to the landfill or new index dollars.

A portion of the required closure activities is completed each year as part of normal landfill operations including activities such as partial final cover construction and associated equipment and labor. The cost for these activities is included in the annual operating budget.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: Closure activities that will be completed in FY20 are included in the FY20 operating budget.

Long-Term Impact: Costs will be included annually in the operations budget for the landfill. The following note was included in the City's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019 related to Landfill Closure and Postclosure Costs:

State and federal laws and regulations require that the City of Columbia place a final cover on its landfill when closed and perform certain maintenance and monitoring functions at the landfill site for thirty years after closure. During fiscal year 1994, the City adopted the



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provisions of Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 18, Accounting for Municipal Solid Waste Landfill Closure and Postclosure Care Costs. GASB No. 18 requires that, in addition to recognizing operating expenses related to current activities of the landfill, an expense provision and related liability be recognized for future closure and postclosure care costs that will be incurred near or after the date the landfill no longer accepts waste. The recognition of these landfill closure and postclosure care costs is accrued ratably over the useful life of the landfill based on the portion of the landfill used during the year and is being recorded in the Solid Waste Utility Enterprise Fund.

Landfill closure and postclosure costs to date are \$9,901,442 which is based on 75.56% usage of the landfill. The recorded liability for unpaid costs, as of September 30, 2019 is \$7,132,919. The City will recognize the remaining costs of closure and postclosure care of \$2,880,045 as the remaining capacity is filled. However, the actual cost of closure and postclosure care may be higher due to inflation, changes in technology, or changes in landfill laws and regulations. The estimated remaining life of the landfill is approximately 8 years.

The City of Columbia has executed a contract of obligation with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources for landfill closure and postclosure care costs. This financial assurance instrument allows the Missouri Department of Natural Resources to collect the required amount from any state funds which could be dispersed to the City should the City fail to perform closure or postclosure care activities.
