Thank you for your work on the North William/Hinkson traffic calming projects Taylor, and for the presentations to the community regarding options.

I support the plans for Hinkson Street speed humps as they have been described to me. However I don't believe this adequately addresses the failure of drivers to stop at the Williams/Hinkson intersection nor at the Hinkson/Old 63 intersection. The four way intersection at William and Hinkson would benefit greatly from a speed table. Please give serious consideration to that safety measure. Additionally, maintenance of street painting (stop bars and crosswalks) is essential. The intersection at Hinkson and Old 63 has no street markings whatsoever and yet is frequented by pedestrians. Therefore a visual marker (such as a painted stop bar) to drivers that they are to STOP not YIELD to the high speed traffic on Old 63 is needed.

Regarding plans for North William Street, I generally support the plans to incorporate chicanes, islands/medians and bulbouts as a traffic calming measure. I am concerned about the lack of detail given as to the choice of vertical markers and ask that you place vertical flex-posts on these new road features.

Designing and implementing safe transportation options for all (pedestrians, cyclists and vehicular traffic) is essential. Thank you for helping to make that possible.
