### Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign an amendment to the CARES Act Funding Agreement between the City of Columbia and Boone County. This amendment expands the reimbursable activities from the original application to include hotel, food and supplies for COVID-19 cases in isolation/quarantine and mailing supplies for isolation/quarantine informational packets. The contract amount shall not exceed \$1,799,004.64 for the period of August 1, 2020 through December 30, 2020.

#### Discussion

This agreement provides CARES Act funding from Boone County to Public Health and Human Services. This amendment will be used to reimburse the City of Columbia for the following services not outlined in the original agreement:

1. Use \$10,000 to reimburse for hotel, food, and cleaning supplies for people in isolate/quarantine.

2. \$7,843.13 to reimburse Meals on Wheels for meals for families in quarantine/isolation

3. \$10,048.50 for printing, postage, paper, envelopes, etc. for sending packets to cases who we are not able to contact by phone.

According to federal guidance, the funding needs to be expended by December 30, 2020.
