AGREEMENT For PROFESSIONAL SERVICES Between THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI And JAWHITT, LLC

THIS AGREEMENT (hereinafter "Agreement") between the City of Columbia, Missouri, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "City") and **JAWhitt, LLC**, with an address of **3805 Keystone Court, Columbia, Missouri 65203**, (hereinafter "Consultant") is entered into on the date of the last signatory noted below (the "Effective Date").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, City desires to engage the Consultant to render certain professional services as outlined in the Scope of Work in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Consultant represents and warrants that Consultant is equipped, competent, and able to provide all of the professional services necessary or appropriate in accordance with this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto, for good and sufficient consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, intending to be legally bound, do hereby agree as follows.

1. **Services.** City agrees to engage the services of the Consultant and the Consultant agrees to perform the professional services outlined in Exhibit A. City may add to the Consultant services or delete therefrom activities of a similar nature, provided that the total cost of such work does not exceed the total cost allowance as specified herein. Consultant shall undertake such changed activities or prepare written reports only upon the direction of the City. All such directives and changes shall be in written form and prepared and approved by the City Manager and shall be accepted and countersigned by the Consultant.

2. **Subcontracts.** Consultant represents that Consultant will secure at Consultant's own expense, all personnel required to perform the services called for under this Agreement by Consultant. None of the work or services covered by this Agreement shall be subcontracted or assigned without the written approval of City.

3. **Term.** The services of Consultant shall commence as soon as practicable after the execution of this Agreement, unless otherwise directed in writing, and shall be undertaken and completed in such sequence as to assure their expeditious completion in the light of the purposes of the Agreement, but in any event, all of the services

required hereunder shall be completed by **September 30, 2022**, unless the Parties agree otherwise, in writing.

4. **Payment.** City agrees to pay Consultant the sum of **fifty-five thousand dollars** (\$55,000.00) which shall constitute complete compensation for all services and payment of expenses to be rendered under this Agreement. Payment shall be made as follows: **paid upon the submission of a monthly invoice**. It is expressly understood that in no event will the total amount to be paid to Consultant under the terms of this Agreement or any amendment thereto exceed the sum set forth in this paragraph unless otherwise agreed to in writing between the parties in advance of the provision of such services.

5. **Termination.** City shall have the right at any time by written notice to Consultant to terminate and cancel this Agreement, without cause, for the convenience of City. In such event, Consultant shall immediately stop work and City shall not be liable to Consultant except for payment for actual work performed prior to such notice in an amount proportionate to the completed contract price and for the actual costs of preparations made by Consultant for the performance of the cancelled portions of the contract, including a reasonable allowance of profit applicable to the actual work performed. Anticipatory profits and consequential damages shall not be recoverable by Consultant. Should City terminate this Agreement, Consultant shall refund any advance payment made and amount due to the City within thirty (30) days of the termination date.

6. **Notices.** Any notice, demand, request, or communication required or authorized by the Agreement shall be delivered either by hand, facsimile, overnight courier or mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid, to:

The designation and titles of the person to be notified or the address of such person may be changed at any time by written notice. Any such notice, demand, request, or communication shall be deemed delivered on receipt if delivered by hand and on deposit by the sending party if delivered by courier or U.S. mail.

7. **Compliance with Laws.** Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.

8. **Governing Law and Venue.** This Agreement shall be governed, interpreted, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri and/or the laws of the United States, as applicable. The venue for all litigation arising out of, or relating to this Agreement, shall be in Boone County, Missouri, or the United States Western District of Missouri. The Parties hereto irrevocably agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of such courts in the State of Missouri. The Parties agree to waive any defense of forum non conveniens.

9. Employment of Unauthorized Aliens Prohibited. Consultant agrees to comply with Missouri Revised Statute Section 285.530 in that Consultant shall not knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the state of Missouri. As a condition for the award of this Agreement the Consultant shall, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, affirm its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Consultant shall also sign an affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services. Consultant shall require any subcontractor to affirmatively state in its contract with Consultant that the subcontractor shall not knowingly employ, hire for employment or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the state of Missouri. Consultant shall also require any subcontractor to provide Consultant with a sworn affidavit under the penalty of perjury attesting to the fact that the subcontractor's employees are lawfully present in the United States.

10. **No Third-Party Beneficiary.** No provision of the Agreement is intended to nor shall it in any way inure to the benefit of any person, so as to constitute any such person a third-party beneficiary under the Agreement.

11. **No Assignment.** This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the Parties and their respective successors and permitted assigns. Neither Party shall assign this Agreement or any of its rights or obligations hereunder without the prior written consent of the other Party.

12. **No Waiver of Immunities.** In no event shall the language of this Agreement constitute or be construed as a waiver or limitation for either party's rights or defenses with regard to each party's applicable sovereign, governmental, or official immunities and protections as provided by federal and state constitutions or laws.

13. HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT: To the fullest extent not prohibited by law, Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the City of Columbia, its directors, officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses (including but not limited to attorney's fees) for bodily injury and/or property damage arising by reason of any act or failure to act, negligent or otherwise, of Consultant, of any subcontractor (meaning anyone, including but not limited to consultants having a contract with Consultant or a subcontractor for part of the services), of anyone directly or indirectly employed by Consultant or by any subcontractor, or of anyone for whose acts the Consultant or its subcontractor may be liable, in connection with providing these services. This provision does not, however, require Consultant to indemnify, hold harmless, or defend the City of Columbia from the City of Columbia's own negligence.

14. **Professional Oversight Indemnification.** Consultant understands and agrees that City has contracted with Consultant based upon Consultant's representations that Consultant is a skilled professional and fully able to provide the services set out in this Agreement. In addition to any other indemnification set out in this Agreement, Consultant agrees to defend, indemnify and hold and save harmless City from any and all claims, settlements, and judgments whatsoever arising out of City's alleged negligence in hiring or failing to properly supervise Consultant.

15. Audit. Consultant shall maintain financial records according to generally accepted accounting standards. City has the right, at its sole expense and during normal working hours, to examine the records of Consultant to the extent reasonably necessary to verify the accuracy of any statement, charge or computation made pursuant to this Agreement.

16. **Nondiscrimination.** During the performance of this Agreement, Consultant shall not discriminate against any employee, applicant for employment or recipient of services because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, disability, national origin, or any other legally protected category. Consultant shall comply with all provisions of laws, rules and regulations governing the regulation of Equal Employment Opportunity including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Chapter 12 of the City of Columbia's Code of Ordinances.

17. **General Independent Contractor.** This Agreement does not create an employee/employer relationship between the Parties. It is the Parties' intention that the Consultant will be an independent contractor and not the City's employee for all purposes.

18. **Counterparts and Electronic Signatures.** This Agreement may be signed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same document. Faxed signatures, or scanned and electronically transmitted signatures, on this Agreement or any notice delivered pursuant to this Agreement, shall be deemed to have the same legal effect as original signatures on this Agreement.

19. **Contract Documents.** This Agreement includes the following exhibits, which are incorporated herein by reference:

20. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties. No modification, amendment, or waiver of any of the provisions of this agreement shall be effective unless in writing specifically referring hereto, and signed by both parties.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF WORK

Consultant shall collaborate with the City of Columbia, Regional Economic Development Inc. (REDI), Missouri Women's Business Center (MoWBC), Small Business Administration (SBA), University of Missouri Extension/Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC), Chamber of Commerce, and other institutions and organizations to develop a comprehensive program to assist disadvantaged business enterprises, including minority and women owned businesses, disabled veteran owned businesses, and businesses owned by LGBTQ individuals in the mid-Missouri region and beyond.

Through the Supplier Diversity program and as part of the City's Economic Development Department, the Consultant shall serve as a resource for business development and employment of socially and economically disadvantaged individuals.

Consultant shall provide advocacy, oversight and administration of programs to assist, maintain and grow the number of companies listed in the COMO Minority and Women Owned Businesss Directory and encourage local businesses to utilize these companies in their procurement practices.

Consultant shall work with community partners to recommend best practices and develop a program focused on reducing economic disparity for minority and women owned businesses, disabled veteran owned businesses and businesses owned by LGBTQ individuals so they may compete in government and private sector opportunities.

Key programs which will be administered in FY22 include, but are not limited to:

- MWBE Business Week and Expo
- MWBE Networking Meetings
- State and Federal Certification for MWBEs
- Coordination with REDI's Entrepreneurship Program, including Hub programming
- Youth Entrepreneurship Program
- Supplier Diversity Bi-monthly Newsletter
- Various marketing, outreach, and social media programs

In addition, Consultant will build support and funding for the Sharp End Entrepreneurial Development Fund (SEED) which is a tool to invest in underserved businesses through targeted grants.

- The SEED Grant Program will be offered a minimum of twice annually, once in the spring and again in the fall (exact dates TBD).
- Training program(s) will be provided to those companies seeking SEED funds prior to cach grant round to assist companies in preparing their application(s) and presentation(s).
- The SEED Grant Program will seek funding through private donations, City of Columbia funding, and participation in the CoMoGives Campaign.

• Consultant serves as Chair of the SEED grant committee.

Consultant will also continue to develop and promote the Historic Sharp End Business District and the African American Heritage Trail.

- Consultant will work jointly with the City of Columbia Parks and Recreation Department to plan community-wide African American Heritage Trail tours during the Juneteenth National Holiday.
- Assist with tour guides and promotional information to organizations taking the tour; and, coordinate tours with students from Columbia Public Schools.
- Consultant serves as Chair of the Sharp End and African American Heritage Committee.

This Scope of Work is based on the Consultant maintaining a 40 hour work week.

- Percentage of time for the three (3) program areas noted above is as follows:
 - 80% Supplier Diversity Program
 - o 10% SEED Grant Fund Program
 - o 10% Sharp End Business District and African American Heritage Trail Program
- Three weeks annually of vacation and personal time; time off to be approved in advance by Economic Development Director.
- Office hours consistent with REDI staff office hours.
- Adherence to City of Columbia Holiday Schedule.
- Office located at REDI, 500 E. Walnut Street, Suite 102, Columbia MO 65201
- Access to training room and meeting rooms located at REDI in Suites 102, 103, and 105.
