Re: Grant award agreement amendment with the Missouri Foundation for Health and Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture for the Clary-Shy Community Park

Executive Summary

The Parks and Recreation Department is requesting Council approval to authorize the City Manager to execute a grant award agreement amendment with the Missouri Foundation for Health (MFH) and the Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture (CCUA). The grant award agreement with the Missouri Foundation for Health and the CCUA was originally approved on August 21, 2017 (Resolution 115-17). The original agreement included grant funding from the Missouri Foundation for Health totaling \$700,000, which is being used to supplement the construction and programming costs of the Clary-Shy Community Park. An additional amendment to the original agreement was approved by City Council on April 15, 2019, which redirected funding for construction of the CCUA operations complex and funding for the community food assessment. This amendment agreement will make three changes to the original agreement. The project will be approved for a period of 52 months that began on September 1, 2017 and will be extended to end on December 31, 2021. The final report from the City to Missouri Foundation for Health staff will be due on January 31, 2022. The final grant funding disbursement will be issued in February 2022. Staff has completed all capital improvements related to the MFH grant and the agreement will now conclude on December 31, 2021.

Discussion

On August 21, 2017, the City Council approved a grant award agreement with the Missouri Foundation for Health (MFH) and the Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture (CCUA). The grant award, totaling \$700,000, is being used to supplement the construction and programming costs of the Clary-Shy Community Park. The grant from MFH focuses on three key outcomes including a community food assessment, supplementing funding for capital construction costs and programming at the park by CCUA staff after completion of the capital construction. All capital projects associated with the grant have been completed. An amendment to the original agreement was approved by City Council on April 15, 2019, which redirected funding for construction of the CCUA operations complex and funding for the community food assessment. Staff is requesting council approval to authorize the City Manager to execute a second grant agreement amendment with the Missouri Foundation for Health (MFH) and the Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture (CCUA).

The grant award agreement amendment with the Missouri Foundation for Health and Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture makes three changes to the original agreement:

1. The project will be approved for a period of 52 months beginning on September 1, 2017 and ending on December 31, 2021. The original grant agreement was approved for a period of 48 months beginning September 1, 2017 and ending on August 31,



2021. The time extension will allow park staff and CCUA staff time to complete the final report for the grant.

2. The final report from the City to Missouri Foundation for Health staff will be due on January 31, 2022. The original due date for the final report was September 30, 2021.
3. With the extension of the grant timeline and due date for the final report, the final disbursement of grant funding will now be scheduled for February 2022. The final disbursement was originally scheduled to be completed in October 2021.

Park staff has completed the construction improvements associated with the grant and CCUA staff are nearing completion of the programming work associated with the Missouri Foundation for Health grant. The agreement with MFH and CCUA will now conclude on December 31, 2021. The final report will be submitted by January 31, 2022.
