5 Bold Steps toward Columbia's Future

The participants were divided into small groups to discuss ideas and topics the city might accomplish over the next 20-25 years. Council Members and Staff were encouraged to have fun and dream big with their ideas. Some of the key items that were common from all the groups are listed below:

Desire for the prosperity and expansion of the airport

- Desire to attain stable housing for all residents
- Desire for the City of Columbia to be an employer of choice

Desire for Columbia to excel in offering health services/mental health services to all residents

Desire for Columbia to be a safe city with a low crime rate

Desire for there to be a high level of collaboration between police and citizens Desire for Columbia to have a thriving economy with an abundance of family supporting jobs

Desire for Columbia to be a leader in the use of renewable energy Desire for Columbia to achieve high levels of citizen engagement from all parts of the community
