Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign an amendment to the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services Public Health Emergency Preparedness contract. The agreement period is July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

Discussion

This amendment allows the Columbia / Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services (PHHS) to receive remaining funding from the State of Missouri for public health emergency preparedness. The purpose of this contract is to demonstrate measurable and sustainable progress toward achieving public health and healthcare preparedness capabilities and to promote prepared and resilient communities. This amended agreement provides an additional \$84,825 for the contract period of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026, for a total award of \$170,081.
