Re: April 2025 Municipal Election

Executive Summary

A council bill has been prepared to call the municipal election for April 5, 2022.

Discussion

Under the City Charter, a regular election for municipal officials is held every April. In April 2025, the election will be for the council member-at-large (mayor) and council members for Wards 3 and 4. Each candidate for the council member-at-large position must file a nominating petition signed by at least 100 but no more than 150 registered voters; the candidates for the Wards 3 and 4 positions must file a nominating petition signed by at least 50 but no more than 75 registered voters entitled to vote for the candidate. Nominating petitions for all candidates must be filed no later than January 14, 2025.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: Fiscal impact unknown at this time as the cost is based on the various entities who have placed an item on the ballot for any particular election. In 2022, the City's proportionate share for the costs relating to the municipal election for Mayor and Wards 3 and 4 council members, and special election to impose a local use tax, was \$65,383.33 with 18 entities having items on the ballot. In 2024, the City's proportionate share for the costs relating to the municipal election for Wards 2 and 6 council members, and recall of the Ward 1 council member, was \$30,265.02 with 17 entities having items on the ballot.
