Re: Grant Renewal – FY2025 Hazardous Moving Violation (HMV) Unit Grant

## Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration an ordinance authorizing acceptance of the Full Time Hazardous Moving Violation (HMV) Unit Grant in the amount of \$59,533.12 from the Missouri Department of Transportation and authorizing the City Manager and Chief of Police to sign the contract.

## Discussion

This grant renewal continues funding one (1) full time HMV officer at 50% of the officer's salary/benefits and some funding for HMV related training. This grant position will continue to concentrate on hazardous moving violations in high traffic crash areas. Types of violations include: speeding, driving too fast for conditions and/or following too closely.

This contract period is October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.

## Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The Full Time HMV Unit Grant will offset 50% of the cost budgeted for one existing officer position in FY25 (\$56,033.12) and provide additional funding for training. Both revenue and expense were included in the FY25 budget

Long-Term Impact: 12 month grant – no anticipated cost for years beyond two.
