The agenda mentioned questions so I was unsure if you want them in advance or not.

Sierra Club would like information on what scenarios will be studied in the next IRP. Sierra Club is very interested in a scenario that replaces Sikeston's power with renewable energy in conjunction with the closing of the Sikeston plant, which might take the utility to approximately 65% renewable energy in the year of closure. Additionally, this scenario could include later targets of 75% renewable energy by 2033 and 100% by 2035.

We are also interested in progress with Advanced Metering Infrastructure. Is the city planning to contract with Ameresco? What is the timeline?

As we've been told that a Pay-As-You-Save program depends on AMI, we are interested how quickly this program can be implemented along with AMI.

We are interested in more energy efficiency program opportunities focused on Low or Middle Income households. What work is being done in this area?
