

Q1. What ideas do you have about the basketball courts?

I'm not a neighborhood member, and only am in Douglass Park 1-2 per year for events. However, I am friends with several members of 5th Street Christian Church and know how much they have done to try to make the Park and its regular patrons a vital part of that immediate neighborhood. Whatever the folks who use the Park, or live adjacent to it, is what should happen there.

I attended the May 31 forum, and agreed with almost everything I heard from the folks who were there. 1) actively maintain and upgrade the splash park 2) storage space is needed for more activities 3) honoring and recognition of the history and heritage of the Park being recognized in some manner, possibly including the naming of some activities or areas 4) strong investment in partnerships with other organizations like Powerhouse and P.E.A.C.E. and Hope, etc 5) enhancement of the "Community Connectors" program... possibly including specially assigned police officers or connectors assigned to the police department 6) accessible and enclosed playground for 5-12 years and also play areas for older than 12 years 7) review of transportation options to the Park, and avenues of safe and secure access to the Park; including walkways, crossings, bridges, etc 8) more robust information dissemination about scholarships for various programs



Dear Shawna Johnson:

We at in the Douglass Park Neighborhood appreciate the interest the City of Columbia has in upgrading the Douglass Park facilities.

As you may remember, I assigned myself the task of canvassing the population at the Park on that day, by securing questionnaires/surveys sheets from you to disseminate to the neighbors. Many readily advised me that would take the questionnaire, but most likely could not return it. So, what I did that day and a few days afterward was to invite the neighbors at the park to allow me to used their responses to the questionnaire in a combined effort.

The following feedback is from **approximately 50 participants**:

Question No. 1	Name of the court – Douglass Bulldog Basketball Courts Names from former teachers from the 1950's and 1960, such as George Brooks, Emma Mae Turner both taught Physical Education, Math and Science Added facilities: water fountain, restroom on the east side of the park, instead of the porta potty; lighting
Question No. 2	A Clubhouse to host events, such as funeral repasses, could serve as a place for home work sessions; Blind Book Center can be utilized for this as a service to the community.
Question No. 3	A bronze statue of Frederick Douglass erected at the entrance the park on Rogers and 5 th Street More park benches – as present citizens must bring chairs Handicapped consideration – there are many citizens who are confined to wheelchairs. Electricity under shelters; more shelters Speed bumps on 5 th Street Painted permanent sidewalk games like hopscotch; shuffle, checkers Horseshoe pit; miniature golf course instead of the skate park

No. 3 (Con't) Douglass Pool Heated
Concession stand for use by the citizens
Move the children's play area closer in; many strangers cut through the park,
who be dangerous to our youngsters.
3 or 4 more BBQ Grills
A tree bench – take one of the trees and built a bench surrounding it.

Question No. 1a Answers ranged from 2 days to 7 times per week. Personally, I go there during nice weather at least five days per week. Many workers take lunch breaks at Douglass Park. Elderly gather for socialization on a daily bases during nice weather.

Another individual revealed that he has been living at the park for more than two years; for he is homeless.


Question No. 2a Many of the participants lived within 1-2 miles; some actually live in the Project Building in the neighborhood. Some lived 3 to 5 miles. Others said they lived in other cities, like Fayette, Fulton and as far as St. Louis.

Question No. 3a Water drainage problems that occurs whenever it rains, that results in a hugh puddle of water that children are subject to drowning. Near this area is a large tunnel opening large enough for a child to get stuck in.

Answers for this question was voluminous: See #3 above.

To kick off the evening, Community Engagement Coordinator welcomed everyone and introduced the staff present. She gave an overview of what to expect. Parks and Recreation Director gave an overview of the project thus far. (See powerpoint presentation.) Following this, attendees were asked to respond, in no particular order, to the following 3 questions:

1. What ideas do you have about the basketball courts?
2. What activities and/or programming would you like to see more of in the park? (These can be private, family, City-sponsored or community-led, etc.)
3. What facilities or amenities would you like to see added at Douglass Park?

Discussion notes:

The following is a paraphrased transcript of the comments by residents and responses from staff. These were transcribed throughout the meeting, with the intent of capturing the overall concerns and tone of those present. These notes are generalities, not word-for-word recordings. Discussion moved quickly at times and not all names were captured.

Citizen Question: Why was it postponed

Staff Response: Announced we were moving forward with the painting, and residents had concerns and opinions about the painting going on the court and council asked us to revisit

Citizen Comment: Still going to change the name of the basketball court?

Staff Response: It is open right now and we want to get feedback on that tonight. No planned name as of right now

Discussion Topics:

What ideas do you have about the basketball courts:

Citizen Comment: concerns about the understanding - there was community feedback and there was a pause

Change the narrative- not forcing the city to do something. -Pause isn't the right word- we wanted to work together

Citizen Comment: When does the painting need to take place by?

Staff Response: This is the last step in the process. We own the shelters and scoregoals. These things are continuing to move forward. Paint and logo- early November or in spring when it warms back up (dependent on winter weather) this is the last step.

-New colors

- 30 days after the concrete is poured: winter is really the only thing that gets in the way.

Citizen Comment: when will this ideally get poured:

Staff Response: Ideally pouring September to Early October, need to meet steps. Some steps are scheduled. Courts are playable right now.

Citizen Comment: Design for funding - is this separate from ARPA?

Staff Response: o this is all part of the project and will not change at the time. \$150,000 designated for these courts right now. It is all in place. We will not have to look for additional funding.

Citizen Comment: Drainage included?

Staff Response: Yes this is included. When pouring the new sidewalks we will look into the drainage. Mature trees around the shelter that we want to keep.

Citizen Comment: funding piece- MU pulled some funding- does it affect this project?

Staff Response: No, it won't change anything. Drainage is included in part of this project. Scoreboard ordering, branding, they are black in color and the tempered glass for goals. No proposed logos on any of the items.

Citizen Comment: Is the branding and logo the intent of this meeting tonight?

Staff Response: yes this is part of the agenda

Media Comment:

People in the park and giving their input to us: They want the city to come down there and talk to them.

Staff Response: Community connectors will be going to the park and will be having those discussions.

Citizen Comment: Keep it historic- Douglass park, the high school, the mascot, a mural with the faces. Representation of all .

Staff Comment: Public input meeting with the revised plans will also be at the park.

Media Comment: Saying- individuals are not comfortable coming to these meetings, we need to go and meet them. They are in the space that they are in.

Citizen Comment: Documentation in the February meeting referenced bathrooms- where are we at with this

Staff Comment: Next project is restroom and baseball fields- currently unfunded at this time. The next steps will be finding funding for that project.

Citizen Comment: Pretty park but not safe. Need to address this first. No monitoring of these activities: drugs, violence, etc. If it ain't safe what difference will this make.

Staff Comment: What does a safe park look like to you?

Citizen Comment:

- Community policing - Mike Matthis.- safety first. People would have input and buy-in
- Police would be grilling
- 60 days no shootings
- Give opportunity for those folks who were involved in prostitution

Relationships!!

We have got to get the people that are down there to come to these meetings. Kids do what they see and what they hear.

Citizen Comment: Are the community connectors going into the neighborhood and park to get their opinions?

Staff Comment: Yes they have already begun doing so and they have more dates where they will continue to do that.

Citizen Comment: The media need to know what the city is doing as well- shows that the city shows that they care.

Citizen Comment: In June, will you be at the Juneteenth events and events in the district that could be surveyed.

Staff Comment: yes, connectors will be going to these events to connect

- Office hours- drop in sessions
- time to go to douglass park
- other events that have resource tables * look into these

Citizen Comment: missing outreach. Douglass Park neighborhood association/coalition needs to be reestablished.

Douglass High School may be very helpful to invite people - school could also benefit from this.

Citizen Comment: Add to that: having as much information as possible- People are no longer in that neighborhood anymore- public housing- not the owner of that property - people who are not living in that community anymore who are engaged in this. Who is wanting to, who is able, and who has

history with Douglass Park. CPS has alternate programming and has become disconnected with Douglass Park

- Need to know who is still living there

Citizen Comment: Challenge with the city is recognizing that displacement is part of it and building relationships. Why is that disconnect happening? Relationships that need to be repaired. There was no central point of connection to people who live in the area.

Citizen Comment: The community doesn't trust the government anymore. Need familiar people to reach out.

Citizen Comment: We are knocking on those doors- I am- will you stand with me. What do we want on that court- we need to work with the city that is the only way to make it happen. Things have happened to break that trust- we impact how the park looks too. That is us- the violence that takes place- that's on us too. The jobs are being done. We need to work together. This is the process - I tip my hat to Glen to all y'all- yeah there is a lot of distrust - you walking those parks they are gonna say you are cops.

-Stand with me. This is why we need the community connectors, but the community needs to be willing to work with them and with the city.

Citizen Comment: Are the only restrooms the ones that have always been there? How much would it cost to get those upgraded:

Staff Comment: \$150,000

Citizen Comment: Before we worked for the cities- Destiny put on hoops for hope- had trophies for the kids and everyone was invited and I was sitting there and it was a real family things- sitting with my 9month old - this guy is walking down the sidewalk and he pulls out his gun and I thought it was fake- and the guy later shot it! Also- in these bathrooms - women have been raped- drugs have been dealt - The bathrooms are not safe. And we need to get a hold of the renters and get an association. We will find the money somehow to get those bathrooms fixed. We want families to come there because that's what makes up the community. It doesn't matter about their past or if they are renters. We have got to work together and love each other enough to work together.

Citizen Comment: That's the one thing that people asked for the restroom in the feedback. Makes me question how the courts came before the bathrooms. The restrooms are not healthy and people don't want to go to those restrooms

Citizen Comment: not just good clean restrooms- but we have some security with them. If they are not secure the rapes and drugs and everything will still happen.

Secure- having some physical presence and having rules about the bathrooms. Have somebody you can call or have the bathrooms locked at a certain time.

Women's stalls don't have doors on them- no lighting in there.

Citizen Comment: bathroom safety and security could it be an option for the male and female facilities to have a 911 call button for someone to use that they can use that button

Citizen Comment: If you find something broken in the park, how do we find that and how do we report that.

Staff Comment: Reporting systems.

- See-click-fix

(Staff showed como.gov website and where to locate reporting options. In this demo, residents expressed confusion and potential barriers for use.)

*****Note for Staff :Talk to IT

- The more likely that people have to click, fill out more information the less likely they are able or wanting to report something.
- Location aspect- need to look into (Adding a specific address versus dropping a pin)

Staff Comment: We'll put that in our parking lot and come back to the discussion about the courts.

Citizen Comment:-Douglass colors- black white and blue

Bulldog 1910 bulldog- Barbara has it - navy blue

Midnight hoops- on the court and come back as programming.

-Cannot treat douglass like we do about all other parks- because it is a historic park- needs to be considered as a historic *

- It is not just a regular park

- community* is what Douglass represents

-needs to be a historical site

- honor the people of the past

-basketball courts should be named after Tracy Edwards

People who may not be associated with the courts but need to be mentioned (walk of fame for the history of the park as a whole)

Tracy Edwards - Caretaker of the pool

-booklet or do something with art- still gonna cost a good chunk of money- I am uncomfortable with putting a name - suggesting a name or even the colors without an association - without the people who use that park and people who work in the community having a say.

- Not going to build a community without including the people that live there and understand the history
- People who lived in that area that were displaced

Staff Comment: We gotta show these kids something different- agree to disagree with elegance and without disrespect. The problem is with the adults. We gotta take ownership at some point- lets decide to move forward. We got babies out here killing each other.

There is work to be done and there are lives on the line.

Citizen Comment: Important to honor
Oak street, 3rd street - MLK - connection to the people who live there now

Combining the opinions of those who live there and those who have been part of the history of Douglass. City building programming around - there is that bridge and connection -coalition building

There is no programming anymore: Open gym- midnight hoops - color guard- relationship with CPD- people knew parents, they knew grandparents, and built a community. Missing that connection to the past- that is when things fall apart.

Community Connector Comment: Community has changed a lot - I want to make this place better for my kid- I bring lived experience to the table- no one person has to be wrong in this room
-It is our job to stand up and fill in those gaps
- we shouldn't be fighting against each other. These communities have changed- why can't they join the conversation- they need to be here too. People with a history of the park need to be here too. We need to know how far we've come to know where we are going. We need to come together. We cannot create an us versus them. We are all trying to come to the same place.

Citizen Comment: I attended midnights hoops back in the day- and saw a lot of beautiful things- babies holding babies- saw two young uniformed officers who looked scared to death to be there (I can't tell you what perfect security looks like) but parks and rec don't get to pick your own security but having individuals who have some kind of training - need people who want to be there- who enjoy playing basketball

Citizen Comment: Throughout this whole process I have tried to preach community- trying to encourage everyone to come and use their voice. It has always been a community thing- this community raised me and it raised a lot of different people. Move forward- love the idea of seeing the community come together to work with the city through all this.

The park is the last thing that we do have left. We need to save that legacy.

Citizen Comment: Has something changed in park and rec? It seems like they have moved away from having on site people who are at the parks. The paradigm has changed.

Staff Comment: We are trying to figure out how we can bring these things back in parks

- pop up and play days at the park
- bear peak park- once a month.

CPD is working on the park ranger aspects - started to do a little more. We are hoping to do it more frequently.

Citizen Comment: We need more water fountains that work

Simple games- cornhole, horseshoes, tether ball

Bathrooms- reason for the thing of no lights- drug use or you use em to go to sleep- motion sensor lights * could be a solution for this or cameras.

Citizen Comment: Not comfortable with cameras pointing at the bathrooms.

Historically - policed by people within their communities. Networks of consistent people who police the park (they don't have to be police) we have to be willing as a community to come together to solve this too. If people took this seriously- we would see things decrease just from that. This is to begin these discussions. We can't solve all these problems in three meetings. But it has to be consistent and ongoing.

We need to show up and make sure people are feeling safe. Need to honor and will honor - need to keep the ball rolling.

Citizen Comment: Do people drive around and empty trash?

Staff Comment: Parks staff clean out the bathroom and empty trash daily.

Citizen Comment: There needs to be something at the park. (A poster or signage that says " if there is a problem call this number")

Citizen Comment: There used to be a phone. Emergency call boxes ***

Citizen Comment: CSA's, a conversation that could be had that they have their own community service people where they could go to the parks throughout the day and report problems outside when there are events

-continue these conversations with the police department.

Citizen Comment: We used to have a phone call. It was an emergency phone- don't have that anymore. Bathrooms. I am connected with a person who was raped at those bathrooms and the predator was in that bathroom.
