#### **DRAFT - 2026 Legislative Priorities**

#### **General Priorities**

#### Retain Local Control

The City of Columbia opposes legislation that would limit or remove local authority, including legislation that would impact our tobacco enforcement, legislation that would result in new municipal expenses without offsetting revenue to the City of Columbia and/or our residents, impact our ability to adopt and/or enforce a local building codes, or impact our local oversight over short-term rentals.

## Promote Safe and Healthy Communities

The City of Columbia supports legislation that promotes safe and healthy communities and reduces violent crime, including maintaining current state funding levels for public health with a focus on prevention and treatment, identifying additional funding for wrap-around support and mental health services.

### Promote Fiscal Sustainability

The City of Columbia supports legislation that protects municipal taxing authority. We oppose legislation that would limit local revenue, including by eliminating local sales tax on goods or services, replacing local lodging taxes with a statewide lodging tax, or setting user or license fees.

# Support Economic Growth and Development

The City of Columbia supports legislation that promotes economic growth and development, including policies that support the generation and transmission of electricity, improve and expand infrastructure, enhance education and workforce development, increase affordable housing, improve transportation systems, and stimulate economic revitalization.

### **Specific Priorities**

### Public Safety

The City of Columbia supports:

- Amending the State law to match Federal law regarding the possession of handguns by minors.
- Increasing funding for State emergency response agencies.

#### Community Mental Health Services

The City of Columbia supports increasing investment in community mental health services at the State level to assist local governments who are often at the front lines of this issue.

## Affordable Housing Initiatives

The City of Columbia supports legislation aimed at increasing quality affordable housing statewide.

### Preserving Existing City Assets & Infrastructure

The City of Columbia supports legislation that preserves local control over municipal owned assets and infrastructure, including the right-of-way (ROW). Local taxpayers have invested substantial resources in the acquisition, construction and maintenance of streets and sidewalks in the ROW. The local regulation of activities of private companies within the public right of way that cause damage or disruption to the infrastructure funded by the taxpayers along with recoupment of associated costs for use and repair of public right of way should not be preempted by state legislation.

#### I-70 Expansion, Beautification, and Pedestrian Access

The City of Columbia supports the I-70 expansion project. The City is supportive of funding that would enhance beautification efforts and increase safe pedestrian access crossing I-70.

#### Post-Consumer Paint Recycling Program

The City of Columbia supports the creation of a post-consumer paint recycling program. Creating such a program would help reduce contamination from improper disposal and keep leftover paint out of landfills.
