Re: Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity Community Health Worker Initiative Contract

Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity Community Health Worker Initiative Contract amendment 2 between the City of Columbia, MO and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services in an amount not to exceed \$365,420.

Discussion

This contract amendment continues a Community Health Worker initiative (CHWi). The CHWi identifies underserved populations and matches them with Community Health Workers to assist with education, surveillance, referrals to programs and resources in an effort to mitigate COVID-19 and help control risk factors of severe disease. COVID-19 has disproportionately affected populations placed at higher risk and who are medically underserved, including racial and ethnic minority groups, and people living in rural communities who are at higher risk of exposure, infection, hospitalization and mortality.

This amendment was anticipated during the budget process, no budget amendment is necessary.
