Re: Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services Program Services Contract – Crisis Cooperative Agreement Amendment 01

## Executive Summary

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign a an amendment to the Program Services Contract between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services for the Crisis Cooperative Agreement. The agreement period is March 16, 2021 through March 15, 2023, which extends the date in the original agreement and keeps the original amount of funding at \$255,529.

## Discussion

This purpose of this agreement is to demonstrate measurable and sustainable progress toward achieving public health and healthcare preparedness capabilities and promote prepared and resilient communities. These funds will be used to contribute to the response to COVID-19 for local public health and healthcare preparedness related to surveillance, epidemiology, laboratory capacity, infection control, mitigation, communications, and other preparedness response activities associated with COVID-19 response activities. This is an amendment to an agreement that has already been billed at 100%. The Missouri Dept. of Health and Senior Services has asked us to process this amendment in case more funding becomes available.
