Re: Authorizing staff to proceed with the preliminary design and expenditure of funds associated with the proposed construction of the W. Stewart Road and S. West Boulevard Private Common Collector Elimination Project (PCCE) #41.

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for council consideration a resolution authorizing staff to proceed with a preliminary design to determine the feasibility and costs associated with the elimination of a private common collector sewer in the area of W. Stewart Road and S. West Boulevard. Petitions signed by eight (8) property owners were received by staff requesting the construction of public sanitary sewers to replace failing private common collector sewers in the area. The attached Project Graphic shows the potential project area. The owners of the shaded parcels submitted the petition.

Discussion

Based upon the Sewer Utility's current information of the sanitary sewer system in the area there are eleven (11) parcels along W. Stewart Road and S. West Boulevard, that are potentially connected to private common collector sewers, or affected by private common collector sewers and eligible for upgrade to public gravity sewer. The petition requesting public sewer that the City received were signed by property owners from eight (8) of the eleven (11) parcels within the study area. The current private common collector sewer is in poor structural condition and needs to be replaced. If directed by Council, staff will proceed with a preliminary design to determine the feasibility and costs associated with the project and move forward with the public improvement process. Eliminating private common collector sewers is one of the goals for the 5-year Action Plan in the Columbia Wastewater and Stormwater Integrated Management.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: \$40,000 for preliminary design.

Long-Term Impact: The preliminary opinion of cost for the project is \$380,000, which includes design, easements, and construction. In accordance with Section 22-253 of City code, financing for this project will be through Sewer Utility Enterprise Revenue funds.
