Re: Public Hearing for the Hanover Boulevard Traffic Calming Project

## Executive Summary

Public Hearing to consider the installation of traffic calming devices on Hanover Boulevard between Clark Lane and Rice Road. The estimated cost of the project is \$32,000.

## Discussion

Hanover Boulevard scored as the 7<sup>th</sup> highest priority project within the 2022 Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP), with a score of 73.00 out of a possible 100. The scoring system takes a number of factors into consideration including speed, volume, pedestrian generators in the area, proximity to schools, bike routes, and recent crash history. The majority of the scoring (2/3) is based on speed and volume of vehicles. Hanover Boulevard scored at the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile speed of 50.1 mph and has approximately 1,600 vehicles traveling on it per day.

Two Interested Parties (IP) meetings were held for this project. The first IP meeting was held on October 25, 2023. The second IP meeting was held on February 27, 2024.

During the first IP meeting, staff gathered information from the public and listened to potential solutions. The majority of those in attendance and providing feedback were supportive of traffic calming efforts.

Preliminary plans were developed and presented during the second IP meeting. The majority of those in attendance and providing feedback were supportive of the proposed plan for calming.

Staff would like to proceed with the construction of eight speed humps on Hanover Boulevard during the 2024 construction season.

The calming devices will be located at the following locations:

- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near 1510 Hanover Boulevard
- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near 1600 Hanover Boulevard
- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near 1611 Hanover Boulevard
- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near 1703 Hanover Boulevard
- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near Olympic Boulevard
- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near North Charleston Circle
- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near Hidden Creek Court
- Speed hump on Hanover Boulevard near 2002 Hanover Boulevard



Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The estimated cost for the installation of a series of eight speed humps, including signs and markings, is \$32,000 paid from Annual Traffic Calming Funds.

Long-Term Impact: Staff anticipates the replacement of the traffic calming devices every 15 years.
