Re: Partner agreements with three Impact Partners for the Brighter Beginnings program.

## Executive Summary

A resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign Brighter Beginnings Program Data Sharing and HIPAA Business Associate Agreement with Brighter Beginnings Impact Partners, First Chance for Children, Lutheran Family and Children Services, and Bringing Families Together.

## Discussion

The Public Health & Human Services Department has been awarded funds from the Missouri Children’s Trust Fund (CTF) Collective Impact Grant to sustain and expand the Brighter Beginnings program partners. Brighter Beginnings is a collaborative of home visiting, social service, and healthcare providers that seeks to expand and simplify access to support for pregnant and parenting families in Boone County. These partner agreements will allow for payment of \$9,000 to each Impact Partner for the entry and submission of Brighter Beginnings data. The funds are provided by FY25 CTF grant dollars.
