Executive Summary

This resolution authorizes the operations agreements for three outdoor concerts on May 1, 2025, May 29, 2025 and September 2, 2025 in downtown Columbia outside The Blue Note located at 17th N. Ninth Street. Per Section 24-73(b) of the City Code, an agreement must be executed between the City Manager and Organizer because of the street closures and requirements of city services, equipment or support that is outside the ordinary course of business of the city.

Discussion

FPC Live, LLC (dba The Blue Note) has submitted special event applications for three concerts on Ninth Street as a part of the 2025 Central Bank Downtown Live series. The concerts are ticketed events with gates opening at approximately 6:00 p.m. and the concerts ending at approximately 11:30 p.m. Peak attendance at each of these events is estimated at 3,000.

No Thru Traffic signage will be placed at Ninth & Broadway, with channelizers placed in the north turn lane on Broadway. All alleys and points of egress will be secured with a combination of bike rack barricades, snow fencing and vehicular barricades. All street barricades will be compliant with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).

Off-duty officers will assist with traffic flow for Simmons Bank and Commerce Bank north on Ninth Street during setup. Pedestrian traffic will remain open until 4:30 p.m. at which point they will be directed to the main entrance at the north end of the block at Ninth & Walnut.

The City Special Events Committee has been working with the Organizer to address all aspects of the event and its impact to the city. This includes event layout, street closures, parking & traffic plans, emergency & public safety plans, food service & alcohol management plans, utilities, the solid waste plan, and insurance. The committee will continue to work with the organizer prior to the start of the event, including a walk-through inspection, to ensure all aspects of the Operations Agreement are met and approved by the appropriate City staff to ensure a safe and successful event.

The City Council's approval of the Operations Agreement will also serve as approval for excluding the closed locations from the open container and downtown area noise ordinances. In accordance with Section 16-258.1, this specific noise ordinance does not apply to sounds generated during an event or activity for which the City Council has authorized a street closure.
