Re: Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services High Impact HIV Prevention and Surveillance Programs for Health Departments

Executive Summary

An Ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign the High Impact HIV Prevention and Surveillance Programs for Health Departments between the City of Columbia and the Missouri Department of Health and Human Services for the period of August 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025 with an amount not to exceed \$238,261.

Discussion

The High Impact HIV Prevention and Surveillance program supports the development and implementation of programs tailored to preventing human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), ending the HIV epidemic and expanding rapid HIV testing in Missouri. The funding supports the provision of comprehensive HIV services which may include sexually transmitted infection (STI) and viral hepatitis (VH) prevention and testing services to 37 North-Central Missouri communities. The contract combines two previous HIV Prevention and Ending the HIV Epidemic contracts which also served 37 counties while adding a new expanded testing program for the region.
