Re: FY 2023 Hazardous Moving Violation (HMV) Enforcement Grant

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for Council consideration an ordinance authorizing acceptance of the Hazardous Moving Violation (HMV) Enforcement Grant in the amount of \$12,200.00 from the Missouri Department of Transportation; and authorizing the City Manager to sign the contract.

Discussion

This grant provides overtime funding and training for off duty officers to conduct special traffic enforcement of hazardous moving violations in high traffic crash areas. Types of violations include: speeding, driving too fast for conditions and/or following too closely.

This contract period is October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

Fiscal Impact

Short-Term Impact: The grant provides reimbursement for overtime pay and training; no matching funds are required. Both revenue and expense were included in the FY23 budget. Long-Term Impact: No anticipated cost for years beyond two.
