#### **Executive Summary**

A resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign an agreement for services between Columbia Interfaith Resource Center and the City of Columbia, MO.

#### Discussion

The City of Columbia received \$25.2 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to address the public health and economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. On October 2, 2023, the City Council approved a resolution that instructed staff to negotiate agreements for Council consideration utilizing the ARPA funds. This agreement with Columbia Interfaith Resource Center addresses one of the priority areas, homelessness. Under this agreement, Columbia Interfaith Resource Center will provide transportation for Room at the Inn (RATI) guests so guests are able to get to and from the shelter safely. The agreement is for \$65,000 and will end on January 31, 2027.

## Fiscal Impact
