# **Executive Summary**

An ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign the Local Public Health Agency Accreditation Assistance agreement with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services for the period of December 1, 2024 through November 30, 2026 with an amount not to exceed \$91,283.55. This is an amendment to extend the end date of the contract from November 30, 2025 to November 30, 2026.

#### Discussion

The purpose of Local Public Health Agency Accreditation Assistance contract is for the department to implement practices that are supported by public health accreditation. This funding allows the department to improve its data sharing abilities, contract management and performance management process. These funds will also be used to offset the cost of existing staff while working on the Community Health Improvement Plan and the department's strategic plan. This is an existing contract that is being extended to allow staff more time to complete deliverables.
