Re: Program Agreement with Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission for Work Zone Enforcement

Executive Summary

Staff has prepared for council consideration an ordinance authorizing the City Manager to sign a program agreement with Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission for Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) On Call Work Zone Enforcement worked by law enforcement. This program provides reimbursement for Officers overtime when working the details, no matching required.

Discussion

This agreement between City of Columbia and the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MoDOT) is for participation in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) – On Call Work Zone Enforcement Program. The program is designed to improve safety in highway work zones by funding local law enforcement to provide extra details in MoDOT-designated highway work zones with the goal of reducing speeding, crashes and injuries in active construction zones.

The agreement provides 100% reimbursement for POST Certified officer overtime, no matching required.

Each deployment/detail is governed by a Program Order, that will be signed by both parties, specifying the job number, scope of work, start/end dates and available funds for the detail. As these deployments are requested, the program order will be brought to council for approval and fund appropriation.

The term of this agreement is 5 years (2025-2030), with up to two 1-year renewal options.
